
REPORT ON TALENT DAY CELEBRATIONS-2025





REPORT ON SANKRANTHI CELEBRATIONS -2025

Sankranti is one of the most important festivals in Telangana. The people in Telangana celebrate it for 3 days - Bhogi, Sankranti and Kanuma. During this festival entire state is filled with joy and rejoices the New Year in life. Sankranti, also called 'Makara Sankranti' is celebrated to mark the beginning of the harvesting season in India. It is celebrated almost all over the country, especially in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka and Maharashtra. In Telangana the Makara Sankranti is celebrated for three days. During this time, the cultural supremacy of the state comes to the forefront as every place in Telangana reflects the festive spirit. The typical celebration of the 'Makara Sankranti' in Telangana takes place for three days. All houses are decorated. Guests and in laws are invited and sweets are given out to all. People dress themselves up as characters from mythology. The first day, that is Bhogi Panduga, people burn all old articles. The second day, Pedda Panduga is the Sankranti day when the big festival is held. People are dressed in new clothes and pray to God. There are also feasts arranged for the guests. Cock fighting was a favourite game during the Makara Sankranti, but it is now banned in Telangana. The third day, the Kanuma Panduga is the day for having meat after the excessive sweets.

Geethanjali College of Engineering and Technology celebrates this festival both to explore Talent Day and Traditional Day on 11th January,2025 from 10:00Am to 3:30Pm with lots of colourful Rangoli, Kites festival, Decoration, Singing, Dancing and many more. Every year this festival is celebrated as per Sathavahana calendar for nine days starting Mahalaya Amavasya (also known as Mahalaya Amavasya or Pitru Amavasya) till Durgashtami, usually in September– October. It is celebrated for nine days during Durga Navratri. It starts on the day of Mahalaya Amavasya and the 9-day festivities will culminate on "**Saddula Bathukamma**" or "**Pedda Bathukamma**" festival on Ashwayuja Navami, popularly known as Durgashtami which is two days before Dussehra.

At GCET all Teaching and Non-Teaching staff members and students in view of Navaratri Celebrations they have followed Dress Code starting from 3rd October,2024 onwards.

This colourful floral festival of Telangana that symbolizes culture and identity has been celebrated at GCET, with grandeur and enthusiasm amidst the lush green nature in the campus on 5th October at 11: 00Am onwards. 

REPORT ON TEACHERS DAY CELEBRATIONS-2024



Teachers' Day is a special day for the appreciation of teachers. It may include celebrations to honour them for their special contributions in a particular field area, or the community tone in education.
